The only anthropological study specifically devoted to a part of the Marshes was published in Shakir Salim's "Marsh Dwellers of the Euphrates Delta." Salim lived with the Marsh Arabs during 1954-1955, and classified the inhabitants occupationally into cultivators, reed-gatherers, and buffalo breeders (Salim 1962). According to Salim, 82% of households fished, 49% hunted, 66% farmed, 58% cultivated crops for food, 75% used reeds, 78% kept animals or birds, and 2% worked for a wage.
